Refurbishment update

We now know we will need around £110m in order to deliver on all the various refurbishment ideas which were generated in 2018 across the estate.

We are lobbying the Council and central government to honour their promise of ensuring that Lancaster West is a model estate for the 21st century.




We are working with the Lancaster West Neighborhood Team in order to establish a resident hub in Baseline Studios, where we can co-design services, hold resident drop ins and ensure that the LWRA has the facilities to engage with residents across the estate.

We noticed that Grenfell Road was often full of contractor vehicles which meant residents were unable to use it. We raised the issue with the Lancaster West Neighborhood Team and we're pleased that enforcement has now commenced to ensure that residents have more space to park.

Engie

Recently, the RA has made strong representations that the contract covering hot water and heating on the estate with Engie has been unsatisfactory. The Neighbourhood Team are looking into more local engineers who would respond quicker when things go wrong. We will keep you updated!

In a very short time access to the 300s of the walkways from Bramley Road will reopen on. On Thursday 21st March a workshop was the held for affected residents and officers of the Grenfell Walk organisation to ensure that this will be safe. and secure welcoming. **Further** workshops will be held.
