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LEASEHOLDERS UPDATE

After a general mail-out to all the Leaseholders on the Estate and our previous efforts to build a mailing list, we had a very successful meeting of on the 6th November, which was attended by over 50 Leaseholders. It was decided to form a Committee to represent us and following a vote Effi Stergiopoulcu and Helene Hartley from Hurstway walk and Veliassarios Lataris (Ari) and Tony Rey from Clarendon Walk were duly elected. David O'Connell from Barrandon Walk was voted chair.

We arranged a meeting with Kim Taylor-Smith, Deputy Leader of the Council to tell him why we shouldn't be paying for this refurbishment/reparations and why they seem to have forgotten about the promise of the Council and Council Leader Elizabeth Campbell to give everyone the same.

The meeting went extremely well, and Kim has promised to go away and look at what can be done. I don't think we have what we want yet, but I do know that we can find a creative way to remove the charges, after all, how many people have to try and carry on living their life in a disaster zone and are expected to pay for it?

The RA has met with Doug Goldring and we will also be bringing it up again with the Government and our new MP, Felicity Buchan.

THE GRENFELL ART PROJECT - UPDATE

The Grenfell Walk Community Art Project is a collaborative art
Project between the Grenfell Walk Residents' Association,
Lancaster West Resident's Association, Lancaster West Neighbourhood
Team and Kensington Aldridge Academy. Following on from residents' decision
to paint the panels across Grenfell Walk light grey, a sample panel has now been
painted and we will set out to hire local experienced residents to paint the remaining panels. More
information will be provided in due course.

It has been agreed that the lights along the panels will be changed, light fixture samples will be presented to residents to vote for the one they prefer. Local children are currently working on their art pieces, once these are completed the artwork will be printed on Dibond panels and is scheduled to be installed in Spring. Residents and the children who participated will be invited to the artwork installation. Confirmed dates for the installation of the artwork will be circulated in due course.
